FEATURES:

- Low growing, native shrub.
- A prolific display of brilliant orange flowers from autumn through to early spring.
- Hardy, easy to grow and frost hardy.
- Tolerant of dry conditions once established.

SUGGESTED USES:

- Mass plant low maintenance areas.
- Native or bush style gardens.
- Winter colour .
- Attracting birds.
- Rockeries or embankments.
- Coastal regions.

CULTURAL CARE

Low maintenance and easy to grow. Dry tolerant once established requiring only occasional long soak during extended periods of heat. Plant in most soil types that are well draining. Prune by up to a third of overall size after flowering in spring to maintain a bushy habit. Feed with a slow release, native fertiliser in spring.

Correas are a well known native to Australian gardeners for their cheery floral displays over the cooler months and attracts many honey eating birds. The genus is named after Jose Francisco de Serra - a Portuguese botanist and are endemic to south eastern regions of Australia.

For massed impact, plant groups of 3-5 plants or integrate into a native mixed border with companions such as Lomandra 'Little Con', Alyogyne 'West Coast Gem' and Tetratheca 'Fairy Bells Snow'.

Grows just as well with exotic plants where it can be blended with the colourful foliage of Loropetalum 'Plum Gorgeous', Teucrium 'Silver Box' and Euphorbias 'Silver Swan' and/or 'Ascot Rainbow'.
