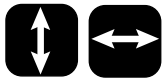




*Cymbalaria* KENILWORTH BLUE

## FEATURES:

- Forms a dense and ornamental mat of low growing, round leafed foliage.
- Profuse display of dainty lilac-blue flowers from summer to autumn.
- Easy to grow and ideal for small or narrow spaces.

## SUGGESTED USES:

- Naturalise as an ornamental ground cover in sunny but protected areas or in part shade.
- Containers and hanging baskets.
- Will cascade over retaining walls and through rockeries.

## CULTURAL CARE

Grows well in most soil types which are moist but well draining. Enjoys a sunny location given protection from strong afternoon sun or in lightly shaded areas. No pruning is required. Apply a slow release fertiliser during spring. Mulch well to help retain moisture during dry periods.

A ground cover that also typically grows in rock and wall crevices or along pathways. Foliage comprises of very small, rounded leaves which is attractive in itself but then a display of what can be likened to small 'snapdragon-like' flowers appear in the spring for a charming show of colour. Ideal ornamental ground cover but will not withstand areas of high foot traffic. The genus name of *Cymbalaria* is derived from the Greek word for cymbals - *Kymbalon*, in reference to the leaf shape. The species name *muralis* comes from the Latin word meaning 'wall' - a likely reference to its ability to grow in the fissures and cracks of old walls. Can be used to underplant most other perennials and to soften edges of garden beds, paved areas or pathways.
