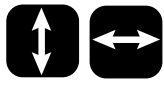




Euphorbia amygdaloides 'Craigieburn'

FEATURES:

- Year round ornamental foliage of deep plum colour accented by red tips of new growth.
- Can tolerate very dry conditions.
- Easy and fast growing for quick results.
- Sprays of vibrant, lime green flowers are produced throughout the warmer months.

SUGGESTED USES:

- Adding permanent structure and colour to mixed borders.
- Small spaces or gardens as well as containers.
- Water wise, gravel or dry style gardens.
- Long season of interest for entertainment areas.

CULTURAL CARE

Grows well in most soils which are well draining. Once established water requirements are low but do not allow to dry out over extended periods of heat. Pruning generally not required other than to tidy. When pruning use gloves as sap can be irritating to skin and eyes. Apply a slow release fertiliser during spring for best results.



Euphorbias form a very large genus of plants with members that vary in appearance to those similar to that of a cacti to the festive, world wide Christmas favourite - Poinsettia. As there are so many varieties in this family they occur naturally over many parts of the world and can come in the form of small annuals through to tall trees. E. 'Craigieburn', however, is an ornamental garden selection from Craigieburn Gardens, Scotland. It makes a charming partnership with other euphorbias such as E. 'Ascot Rainbow', E. 'Rudolph' and E. 'Silver Swan'. Commonly known as 'spurges', the name Euphorbia is believed to date back as far as Pliny the Elder who named it in his book - Natural History of Pliny (79AD) and is thought to be the name of a physician, Euphorbus.
