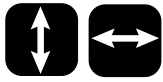

FEATURES:

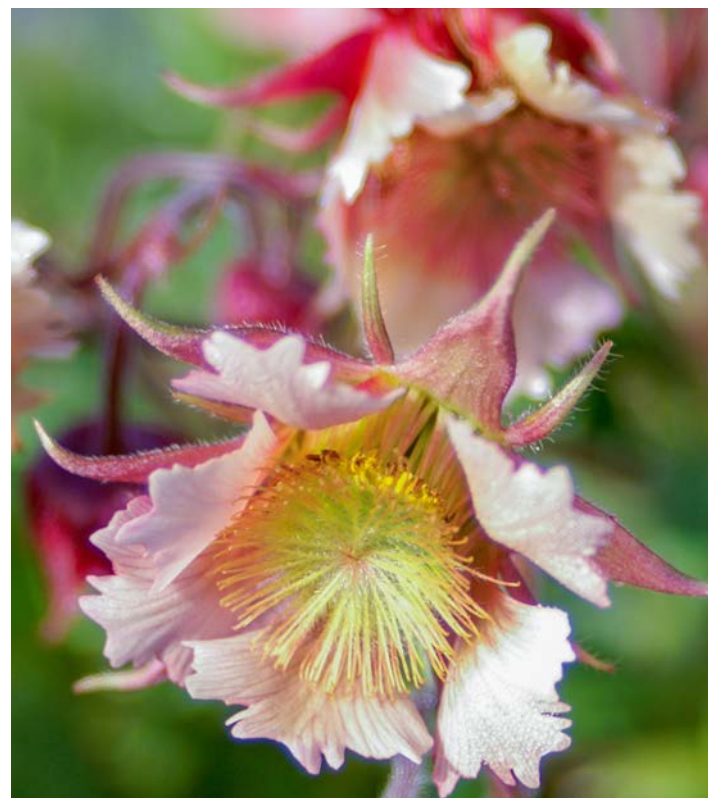
- Dainty, frilly flower heads of soft pink appear through spring with spot flowering over warmer months.
- Evergreen foliage forms neat, low growing mounds - can mass plant as a ground cover.
- Fast growing with no special needs.

SUGGESTED USES:

- Edging for paths, walls or other hard surfaces.
- Rockeries or gravel style gardens.
- Containers.
- Small gardens.
- Fast results for new gardens.
- Mass plant as ground cover.
- General garden use.

CULTURAL CARE

Prefers a moist soil which is well draining. Low maintenance and easy to grow. Apply a slow release fertiliser in autumn. No pruning generally required although removing spent flower heads will encourage further flushes.



Geums are hardy perennials that can be found in temperate regions around the world - many of which are alpine species. Its botanical name of *Geum* originates from the Greek *geno* - to yield an agreeable fragrance - as when freshly dug up the roots have a clove-like aroma. The *rivale* forms typically have 'nodding' flowers and prefer a semi-shaded environment. Pests are seldom a problem and given moisture during hot periods, the delightful geum requires little attention once established. Geums make complementary partners to *Pulmonaria* 'Electric Blue', *Alstroemeria* 'Pick Me Purple', *Iberis* 'Winter Glow' as well as anemone varieties such as A. 'Marchenfee'.
